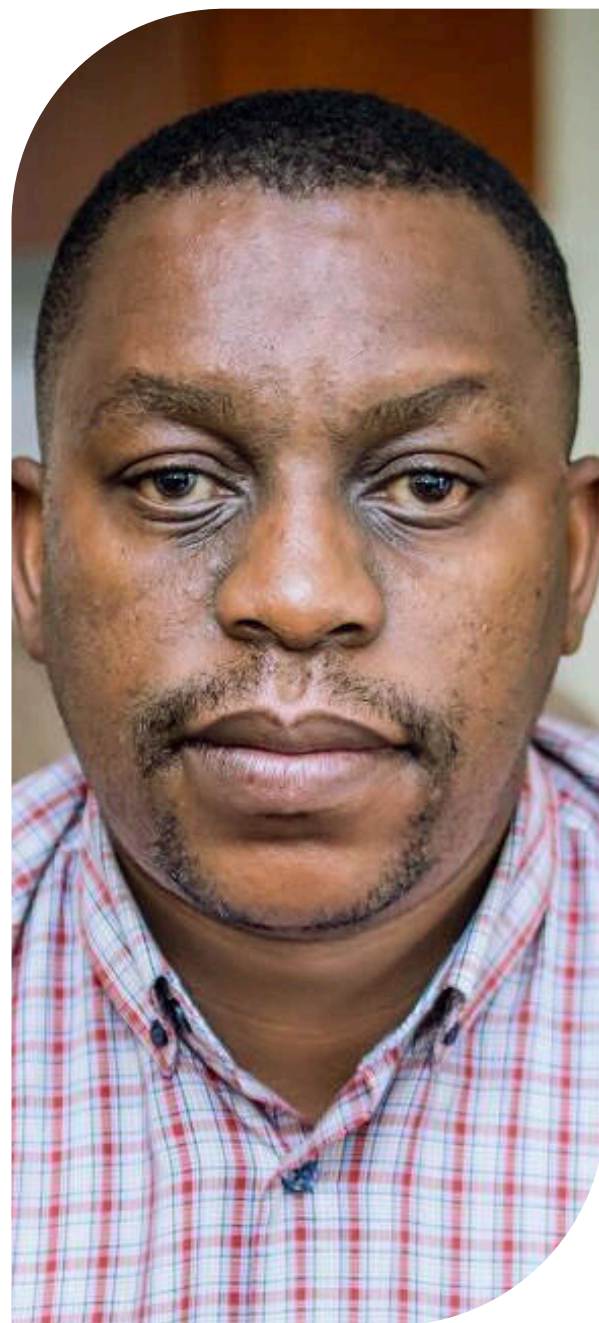

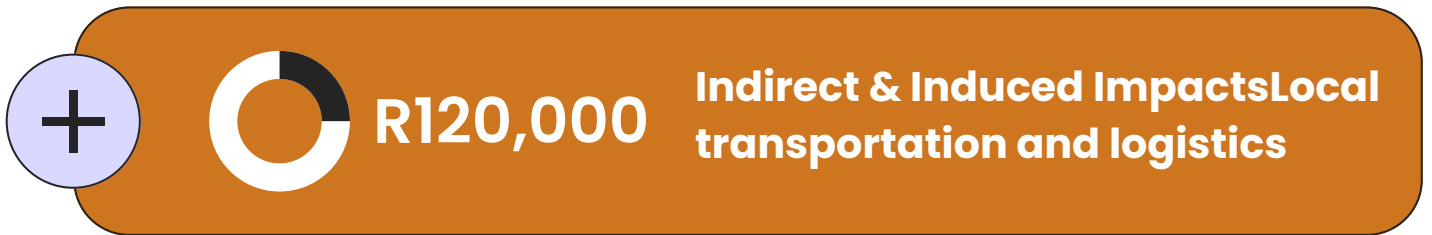

- **Establish Legacy Projects:** Ensure long-term impact in host communities via mentorship, grants, or pilot tourism projects.
